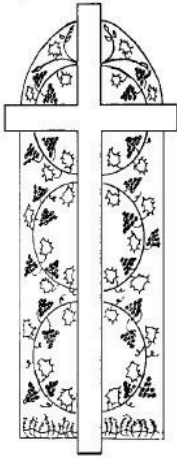

VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS – captured by SARAH LARSON, CLERK
At its meeting on May 9, 2011 the Vestry discussed the following:

PRESENTATION FROM THE CNC CONFIRMATION CLASS: was presented by Lindsay Reamer, Katie Russo, Noah Tagliaferri, Drew Walter, Mike Russo, Ben Richardson, Allen Kohler-Burns, Carmen Puchulu, Cameron Day and Lori Mills-Curran. As part of their Millennium Development Goal Project the class has decided to focus on Goal 6 focusing in on “other diseases”. They were looking specifically at Cystic Fibrosis. The class outlined why they were at Vestry: 1.) to request use of the Parish Media to announce and inform the parish of their efforts 2.) to seek permission to teach an Adult education class on June 12. They started their education with the Vestry defining key facts, what Cystic Fibrosis is, how it impacts individuals. They introduced us to the CF Foundation and their mission. They described the adult ed. forum they are planning to host, the parish letter and posters they plan to share. A MOTION was made by Chris Danielle to approve the CnC class request and seconded by Dave McConnell. The motion PASSED.

PROPERTIES COMMITTEE UPDATE was presented by Rob Adamson. He is receiving lots of feedback from the parish. Rob has secured volunteer hours from a “handyman” and they recently did a walkthrough of the building to identify and prioritize some of the issues (e.g., Sinkholes, mouse droppings, drain by the handicap ramp, missing bricks from steps, windows in classroom doors, Room 5 and Children’s Chapel paint peeling and some water damage.

We are looking for a chair for the Properties committee. If you or know someone who may be interested please speak to the Rev. Julie Carson or Rob Adamson.

PRESENTATION OF A BRAZILIAN CHILDREN’S PROGRAM PROPOSAL was presented by Michel Puchulu. He reviewed what was involved in hosting the program and what St. Andrew’s might gain in hosting the program. A MOTION was made by Rob Adamson to approve the proposal and seconded by Chris Danielle. The motion PASSED.

RECTORS REPORT: was presented by the Rev. Julie Carson. Candidates for the church assistant job are coming in and some promising candidates are emerging. The LDI: moving along beautifully. She recapped our beautiful Holy Week however turnout was disappointing for Thursday night,, Friday night, and Holy Saturday. Easter Sunday there were 200 people at 10 a.m. service; the same as last year. The Vestry will consider ways to reach out and increase the numbers at Holy Week for adult services both existing parishioners and externally. At the Vestry retreat, we talked about forming a group for fundraising and marketing. Anyone interested in participating in this group please see Rev. Julie Carson. Lastly, thanks to everyone for all the hard work and donations on the Spring Fling. Last tally, \$6700 was netted and we are already thinking about next year.

THE SENIOR WARDEN’S REPORT: was presented by Chris Daniele. He is now familiar with the MetroWest daily news and TAB to make things happen. He is working on an Invitation card idea discussed at the Vestry retreat. Chris is aiming to write a Tidings article on evangelism.

NEW BUSINESS: We discussed the Spaghetti supper planned for June 12 at 4 p.m.

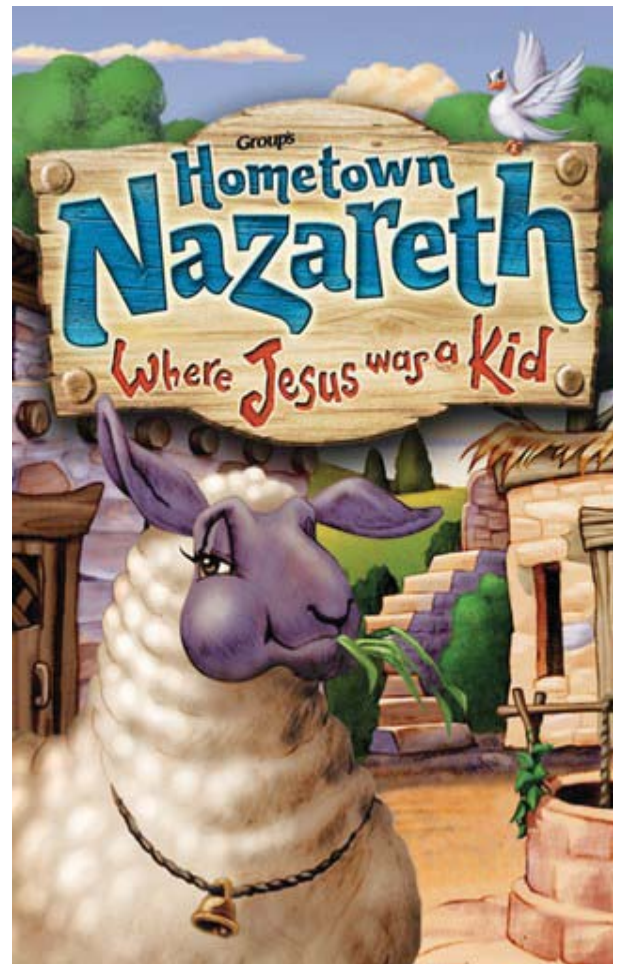
Mission Fundraising Continues Apace All Summer and Into the Fall!

Confirmation Cystic Fibrosis Campaign Wraps Up with Adult Ed Class

Participants in our **Confirm, Not Conform** class will be wrapping up their MDG Campaign by teaching at an adult ed forum on June 12. Please attend and learn all about this terrible disease and what you can do to end it. **Katie Russo, Mike Russo, Cameron Day, Lindsay Reamer, Noah Tagliaferri, Ben Richardson, Allen Kohler-Burns** and their youth sponsors **Drew Walter and Carmen Puchulu** will teach about cystic fibrosis, relate what is needed to cure not just control CF, and tell you how to help. What is a *Núcleo* and why should St. Andrew's have one?

Some of you are aware that St. Andrew's vestry has recently has been asked to host a *Núcleo* and has by unanimous vote agreed. Why did they and what will this entail?

A *Núcleo* is a **special afterschool program**. Small groups of **five to 12 students** will meet in our building for two hours a week, at a time selected in consultation with parish contacts, for a wide range of Portuguese language instruction and Brazilian cultural enrichment activities. The class will be held in a **designated classroom**. Suitable storage will be found for educational supplies, a "little red wagon" filled with books and videos for loan, and a file cabinet.

Similar to a Boy Scout Troop Committee, parents will cooperate to provide a **legal CORI'd teacher** a small stipend for instruction and expenses. Parent aides will also provide two-deep class leadership at all times. **Curriculum materials** are developed by Arlete Falkowski, United States Coordinator of the *Fundação do Movimento Educacionista dos Estados Unidos de America* (EMF). Arlete holds a Master's degree in Education and Human Development.

EMF is the American branch of the *Movimento Educacionista do Brasil*, a well-respected educational improvement society (similar to the PTA), founded by Brazilian Senator Christovam Bourque. EMF has *Núcleos* in Malden, Saugus, Lowell, Alston, Hartford (CT), New York (NY), San Francisco (CA) and is developing a special needs *Núcleo* in Everett. **Teacher training seminars** will be provided at St. Andrew's twice per year (with the first workshop in August '11). Training draws 40-60 participants from all over the U.S. It features leaders from American and Brazilian universities: the last featured Dr. Clemence Jouet-Pastre, coordinator for the Brazil Studies program at the David Rockefeller Center for Latin American Studies at Harvard University.

What might St. Andrew's gain in hosting this program?

- A position of respect in the Brazilian community as a committed host to this well-regarded educational organization.
- A cooperative partnership, instead of an outreach or rental relationship, with a Brazilian-led organization.
- Publicity in the Brazilian media for our parish efforts.
- Assistance in recruiting Brazilian partners for our Leadership Development Initiative Project.
- A credible Brazilian partner for an Episcopal City Mission diocesan grant application, which favors parishes engaged in programs in which "immigrant members are part of the parish or project leadership."
- Future developments might include Portuguese-language Boy Scouting, in cooperation with existing Knox Trail Council outreach efforts.

Best of all, your child could be included!

Although this program is being initiated by Brazilians, *any* child is invited to participate for the same small fee. Many parents would like their child to have private language lessons but can't afford it. This is one way to make those ends meet.
