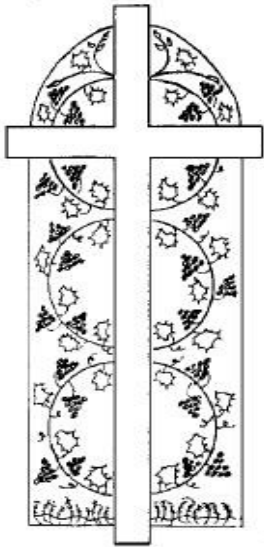

# Sabbatical Committee

In keeping with diocese goals, our employment contract with Julie includes provision for a sabbatical after five years of service. Hard to believe, but that time has come! In preparation for Julie's sabbatical which will begin May 1 2012, a Parish Sabbatical Committee has been formed. The Committee's mission can be summarized by "Four C's"

**Communications** -- Making parish aware of what's going on and keeping people updated about key issues.

**Coverage** -- This relates to staffing and to arranging for pastoral and liturgical coverage in Julie's absence. At its first meeting in November, the committee established initial guidelines which will help make for as seamless a transition as possible. We are hoping to have consistency in coverage over the sabbatical period rather than a substitute rector every week.

**Content Coordination** -- This relates to St. Andrew's staff and making sure that everyone is aware of responsibilities and goals during the sabbatical season (in addition to the May, June and July -- the three months of sabbatical -- Julie will also have a vacation month of August, so will be returning on September 1st. This means that planning for the fall will need to be done in her absence.)

**Congregation Concerns** -- This relates to communications, but flows in the other direction, where committee members will solicit parish input, formal and informal, to make sure that transition issues are identified early and addressed as effectively as possible.

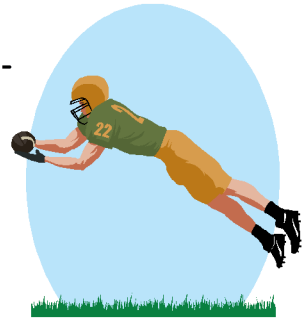
## Must be *Football Playoff* time!

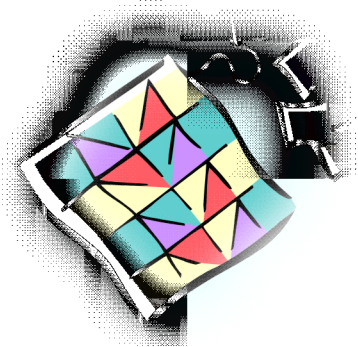

## Communion Instruction Classes Begin Jan. 22

**Why do we do Communion Instruction Classes** for church school students when all our kids already take communion?

People comfortable in their Episcopal shoes ask this question a lot. There are several good reasons to take three or four weeks of the year, every couple of years, to really have the whole church school concentrate on Communion:

- **Parents need help.**

Our church school families differ more and more with each passing year. Many come from backgrounds where children don't take communion or where communion wasn't that important, or were not churchgoers as children.

- **Not all our kids receive.**

There are many people each week who don't take communion, many of them children. If this is one of the "sure and certain means" we have to receive God's grace, as our Prayer

Book states in the Catechism (the outline of our doctrine) on p. 857, why is this so? In Communion class we find out. Often the decision is made for simple reasons: it tastes funny, or the child does not know exactly what to do. We unpack all that in the classroom.

- **Communion is hard.**

Do **you** understand communion? There are so many theological understandings about what is going on in Communion, and the misunderstandings and tensions are a huge ecumenical problem. More people have left the church universal over this issue than over any other, I think. The debate over who's in, who's out; who's welcome, who's not? It's a scandal. Our kids live in a world where more and more people are sitting out church in favor of seeking spirituality" elsewhere over issues just like this.

- **Our kids will benefit.**

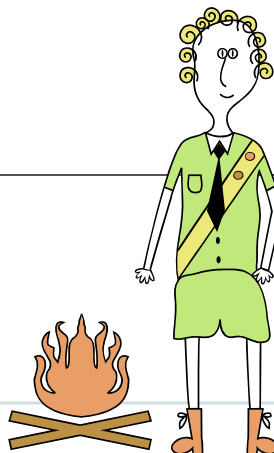
Church does some things right, and communion is one of them. Our traditional stance is to give communion to all baptized Christians. We seem to be moving to an even more open table, and while I have had my concerns in the past that this be done "decently and in order," I have come to see that the spiritual value to newcomers to the tradition of stating that "this is God's table and not our own" resounds with many people. We are, and in our communion practices reveal, that we are an open people who others may join.



**Four weeks of joint classes start on Jan. 22. Join us! This is a good entry point for newcomers, since the unit is self-contained.**
