DEACON'S MESSAGE SEPTEMBER 2018

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. Colossians 3:16 (NRSV)

I hate clutter; it disturbs my sense of good order. I look around my home study and all I see is clutter - papers to be reviewed and filed stacked on my desk; books I've read and books not yet read stacked on my bookshelf and on the floor; pictures and mementos all around me, reminding me of people and places and events that have been important to me over the years. Clutter, clutter, clutter - makes it hard for me to think and to concentrate on whatever work I have to do.

Periodically, I resolve to clean up the clutter - to recycle the papers and books I no longer need; to organize what's important to keep in meaningful ways so I can find it when I need it - with the goal of creating a calm physical space in which I can focus my thoughts and do my best work. I'm in one of those periods right now, once again following the practice of setting aside some period of time every day to clear out some of the clutter. Eventually, the room will be clean and in good order again.

Sometimes, my mind gets cluttered as well. It becomes full of thoughts and images and ideas and worries and to-do lists, repeating themselves over and over and over, and filling up my head until there is little space left for me to hear the sound of sheer silence, to listen to the voice of Jesus speaking to me, to catch the sense of the Holy Spirit blowing through my mind and into my heart. Clutter, clutter, clutter - makes it hard for me to discern and to remember that God is with me, leading me, guiding me, loving me.

Clearing out the clutter in my mind - making space for God - requires practice. For me, it is the practice of setting aside some period of time every day to be with God. Sometimes, I spend this time with God in silent prayer and contemplation, reflecting on scripture and those in need. Sometimes, I spend this time with God out in God's creation, listening to the birds, smelling the flowers, greeting the people I pass. Eventually, my mind is calm and in good order again and I can go about the work that God has given me to do for that day in peace.
